

Dear Parents or Guardians,

July 3, 2025

"Through education, we cultivate the mindset that sees challenges as invitations to grow, allowing us to triumph over even the most formidable obstacles" – Robert Johnson. I am amazed at the success of our students. We have witnessed the middle schoolers whose MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) have soared and our students SAT and ACT scores are unbelievable. As I type this letter we are anxiously awaiting our AP test scores which are released next week. These data points allow us to hold up a mirror to evaluate our teachers, our instruction and the students.

I am hoping this letter serves as an informational piece and guide before we start school.

#### **ORIENTATION:-**

All 6<sup>th</sup> graders are encouraged to attend orientation from 5-7 pm on August 7<sup>th</sup>. It will be held at Heritage Academy and dress code is school related casual clothing.

Parent Orientation will be Aug 11<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm at HHICC (Hilton Head Island Community Church) at 860 William Hilton Parkway on Hilton Head. <u>All</u> parents should attend. What a great way to meet other parents as well. At this meeting, we will begin to develop our parent association for 25-26. It will last one hour.

#### ATHLETICS:

Student have the opportunity to play at their public high school for sports that we don't offer. This year we are offering Boys Golf, Sporting Clays, swim team and sailing. Please complete the appropriate paperwork for SCISA if you are participating in a Heritage Academy sports team. If you plan to play for the public high school please reach out to our Athletic Director, Jalen Whitlow, at Jalen.Whitlow@heritagehhi.com to secure the additional paperwork that must be completed.

#### COMMON QUESTIONS THIS SUMMER:

1. What is the uniform or dress code? Students are expected to dress in a way that will not distract their peers nor the process of learning. Students may not wear pajamas, slippers, beach attire, hats or hoodies on their head. Students need to be presentable and if in question, I (Amanda ONan) will address the student and give an opportunity to change clothes. Flip flops are discouraged due to the fact our steps can get wet and slippery.

- 2. Where do we park if we drive to school? You can parking in our parking lot but spaces are limited. You may also park across the street in Charlie's parking lot. Be careful crossing the street. Stay off phones while walking to school. Students may also park in Nunzios parking lot.
- 3. Rumor has it that school is starting earlier? Yes, we are beginning first block at 7:30 am. Instruction and delivery is crucial and we use about 10 min for morning announcements which takes away ten min from teaching time. Over a week, we lose 50 min of instructional time so we are beginning at 7:30 am to gain that time to teach.
- 4. How can my student stay hydrated? Last year we offered free water bottles to all students to the tun of just over \$5000 as a budget item. And the last two days of school we found 52 water bottles over half of the water left behind or thrown in the trash...very wasteful. So, we have a rising senior who has started his own business and providing us a vending machine of various beverages (Water and healthy options) for students to purchase. We are not making any money off of his new business adventure. We just want to support his entrepreneurial spirit.
- 5. When do we eat lunch and where? We have heard many concerns about the lack of healthy food options. So, we have spent a lot of time looking into lunch options. We are serving (via outside catering company) that serves holt and cold meals each day for \$6.75. For example, there will be grilled chicken wraps and vegetables as side items. Lunch will be served in room 102 as soon as 3<sup>rd</sup> block ends. If students just want snack items like chips or processed food, they can use the vending machine. Students can bring food items and consume in class as they get hungry without being disruptive to the teaching and learning.
- 6. Where do I find information quickly when I need it? Check out our Facebook page or Instagram page @heritageacademy). I try to duplicate what I put on facebook and IG so you only have to check one place. Also, you can check out the web page but that is fluid. And you can text me at 843-707-6455.
- 7. What if I want to change my classes? You can do so, without penalty up through the 5<sup>th</sup> day of instruction which is through Aug 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 8. Do I need to pay for a parking spot? No, parking is a privilege so please be mindful when driving in the parking lot. Avoid distractions such as loud music and when exiting be mindful bikers on the sidewalk are blind to drivers pulling out.
- 9. Can I play on a sports team? Yes, of course. You will need to refer to this letter (attachments) and complete the athletic forms which includes a sports physical. Each year the forms need to be completed even if you did it last year. You also need to know it is a Pay to Play concept. For example, to be on the swim team it is \$250 and needs to be paid before the first swim meet. Golf is \$500. The sporting clay team is more expensive and will be determined at a later time. Sailing is also paid to the SC Yacht Club Prices are apt to change slightly based on enrollment for team. Playing is a privilege. Please see above portion of the letter about the new ability to play at the public schools.

#### CLUBS

I plan to have a variety of clubs to benefit student's interest. If we do not have a club for your student, please let me know. I am open to all ideas. But keep in mind if we have a "democratic club" than we will need a "republican club". We seek balance. Clubs that we intend to offer: Student Govt-by application and selection process only Ambassadors-By application and appointment only Interact Chess Club Yearbook 4-H National Honor Society-By invitation only Skateboarding Club Clubs will meet at various times, depending on the advisor's schedule.

If your student is interested in running for student government for 25-26, they need to complete an application. I have attached it in this letter and it is due to Mrs McGuire by Aug 15th<sup>th</sup>. There will only be two representatives per grade level chosen.

(If your student would like to apply to be an ambassador, please have them submit attached application and return to me prior to Aug 1st. Ambassadors that are selected will have their first meeting Aug 8<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 pm for an hour.)

#### SCHOOL SUPPLIES:

Students will provide their own laptop with Microsoft Office. They will not have direct access to print materials from their personal device so any printing can be emailed to a faculty or printed outside the school. Students will bring their paper, pencils/pens and any assigned textbooks. Students are not issued lockers so all valuable items that are not needed for class should be locked in their homes or vehicles. We are not responsible for any stolen or missing items.

Some teachers may ask students to bring in a composition book, sketch book, a set of highlighters, etc. If that is the case, that will be outlined by that teacher on the first day of school.

#### SCHOOL SAFETY:

Safety is paramount and comes in many ways: Emotional safety, Physical safety, Internet Safety, etc. It is our priority to keep all aspects of your student safe. I thought I would share a few measures in place.

- 1. Keep in mind great teaching eliminates behavior problems. Therefore, a trusting climate eliminates problems among the staff and/or students. Building that culture is not a quick process nor easily done. Having little turn over in the faculty is a great thing as we build a uniform sense and climate that focuses on school safety.
- 2. Details matter. Greeting at the door seems like a greeting but it is a screening. When a teacher or staff greet students at the front of the school or as they walk in their class, it is a way to pick up moods, attitudes, problems and make small talk which builds relationships.
- 3. Each morning on the announcements students are going to be asked to help with safety of everyone. I was raised to feel we are our brother's keeper. Therefore, safety can be something we all take part in. They will be asked to scan the room for odd or sketchy items and report as well as ensure the door is shut and secured during class time.
- 4. We will review an intruder prevention and reaction scenario in detail during Heritage 101 and hold intruder drills.
- 5. When you talk safety, you have to address the internet and things at student's fingertips. We have a blocking software device that prevents students from looking up topics such as firearms and how to build explosives, etc while they are on our server. But keep in mind your student uses their own device and we do not and cannot monitor their social media or internet searches so please safeguard your student knowing that. Middle schoolers cannot use their cell phones

during school. In fact, I don't want to see their cell phone, hear it or think they have it. If we see it, we will confiscate it and return to a parent/guardian.

- 6. There will be an anonymous reporting box for students who wish to report something confidentially. In the past 15 years as principal and Head of School, with thousands of students, no one used this type of reporting method. So, I found them not useful but I don't want to risk someone needing this type of method and not having it.
- 7. An extensive video surveillance system is in place inside and outside with night seeing capabilities and high resolution.
- 8. Each classroom is equipped with a flashcard system used in larger school systems to quickly identify areas of need or problems.
- 9. Tamper proof windows are in place so if a person wanted to throw a brick at the window it would not shatter. It would prevent someone from entering the building via breaking or shooting through a window or at least slow a person down.
- 10. The Sherriff's Dept will conduct a training for our faculty again this year regarding intruders and safety measures. The fire department will conduct a training on universal precautions, fire aid, CPR and epilepsy.
- 11. Our crisis manual is revised and includes a school safety segment, self harm segment and is the guidance for training the faculty and staff.
- 12. All employees and coaches have an annual background search for county and federal crimes including the national criminal search, SSN trace, and sex offender search as well as the Global Watchlist Search.

School safety is paramount. If students do not feel safe, they cannot and will not learn. It leads to anxiety, stress, self medication, depression and secrecy. It is a dangerous and slippery slope. I will do everything in my power to make sure students feel love, safe and nourished.

#### CHANGES IN STAFF

We said good bye to Mrs Deir and Mr Seifrit. Mr Seifrit will continue as our 4H club advisor and sporting clay coach.

This brings me to Mr Kotze, the son of Mr and Mrs Kotze (former teachers at Heritage). He will be teaching middle school math classes. Also, many of you will know Dr Chris Gray, former district teacher of the year and math teacher from the public school. She comes to us to teach math. Welcome back Darcie Patrick to take on our esteemed AP Capstone program.
